A MESSAGE FROM THE HEADMASTER

I suppose by now it is an open secret that some Old Boys asked me to put my name forward as a candidate for Headmaster. At first I poo-hooed the idea, then my attitude changed and I became enthusiastic in my desire to be Headmaster of my old School.

The tables are now turned and I am asking for your support. The Board is well aware of the need for other buildings and is working on a five year plan. In 1967 a new Junior boarding house, Brine House, was built with school funds at a cost of \$120,000. An advance science wing will be built in 1969, and this year additions to existing science facilities will be completed. When the chapel is erected we should be able to erect a gymnasium near the swimming pool and it is then hoped that a substantial new library and modern language laboratory will be able to be erected.

All of these projects are unconnected with each other and none is being sacrificed at the expense of another.

It is essential that the building fund be increased so that all of these projects can be proceeded with before building costs rise.

I urge you to support this appeal and give generously to the building fund.
